This half term : Skills, Knowledge and Understanding to be developed:



Objective assessments:


Students can identify and describe the key words and explore how to identify the difference between crime and deviance

Objective assessments:


Students can identify different forms of social control whilst exploring the role of the police and judiciary system. Students will analyse the impact social control has on society.

Objective assessments:


Students will be able to explore the concept of OCS and the reasons for and against reporting crime. Also examine different types of punishments and their pros and cons.
