Prestatyn High School's after school enrichment timetable complements the successful lessons delivered during the school day and takes place between 3pm and 4pm. The enrichment opportunities provide students with additional learning, new social opportunities, and they help to develop new skills and interests. Enrichment is a fantastic way to increase enjoyment of school life and create an inclusive, community spirit within the school, whilst also increasing skills and building character.
